


Barnyard Newspaper Starter Pots:

Items:


- *Newspaper
- *3"-4" diameter bottle or glass

Instructions:

1. Fold a full sheet of newspaper in 1/3 lengthwise.



2. Place the bottom of the bottle about 2.5" (more than half of the width) up from the bottom of the paper.



3. Roll the newspaper around the bottle.
4. Squirt the loose end with water and press it against the other paper to make them stick together.
5. Squish the newspaper below the bottle against the bottom of the bottle to form the bottom of the pot.
6. Pull out the bottle from the open end of the pot.
7. Compact and form the closed end of the pot. Make it as flat as possible.
8. Spray it with water so it will stick together.
9. Put soil and seed in the pot.
10. Place plant on plate and water it daily.
11. Once the plant has grown, simply place the whole pot into the ground. The newspaper will biodegrade (break down) in 1-5 months and become part of the soil.


