Spiritual Gifts Definition:

Spiritual gifts are special abilities given by Christ through the Holy Spirit to empower believer to do ministries in the church and outside of it.

Special Abilities: "Special" here means out of the ordinary, or above normal. Gifts can take on many different forms. These "abilities" could also be called a strength, an enablement, an empowerment or a competency. People can have more than one spiritual gift. People often disagree about how many "special abilities" are referred to in the Bible because there are a different passages that talk about spiritual gifts. Some special abilities like teaching or administration seem to be mainly natural abilities. On the other hand, gifts like healing or miracles seem more supernatural. The truth is that all gifts have a natural and supernatural (spiritual) dimension. However, the balance in each case they are used may be different -things may shift toward the natural or toward the supernatural.

Given by Christ Through the Holy Spirit: Faith in Christ is required to get a spiritual gift. The Holy Spirit is working in you to hone and develop these gifts. This is important to remember so we can't get cocky or disappointed about the gifts that God gave us. We were given what we were given and are responsible for using them.

To empower the believer: Non-believers have God-given abilities as well. God provides all the abilities talents and skills that humans have. However, the Bible doesn't call the abilities of non-believers spiritual gifts. Probably because they aren't used for the work of ministry, the building of the church or to honor God.

To do ministries in the church and outside of it: Spiritual gifts are given to believers to help build up other believers. This may help make a church larger, but most often it refers to helping people realize who God created them to be. Spiritual Gifts can also be used to serve those outside of the church.
